


ARGENTIERA LANDSCAPE AREA N. 14 GOLFO DELL'ASINARA

EXCERPTS FROM THE AREA GUIDELINES



DESCRIPTION

The area includes the territories lying along the Golfo dell'Asinara which describe a context opening onto, and relating in different ways to, the coastal system.

The cliffs of the western coast in the southern part of the area create relations between coast and inland especially with the mining villages of Argentiera and Porto Palmas.

ELEMENTS

Environment

The western coastal system, one of the most important environmental elements in this landscape area, is defined by cliffs and rocky coasts on the Paleozoic formations and in the south by minerals historically cultivated in the mining center of Argentiera.

Urban

Significant urban elements:

The urban centers of Sassari, Portotorres, Sorso, Sennori, Castelsardo.

Argentiera is a singular episode in an urban system characterized by diverse phenomena varying from diffuse urban sprawl, agricultural use, to rural and coastal centers.

RELATIONS WITH OTHER AREAS


COASTAL RELATIONS

Among the coastal relations are those with the Alghero area, environmental relations of the rocky coast from Porto Ferro a Punta Argentiera in terms of marine dynamics and with the area of Alghero and the urban systems of Nurra and Argentiera.

GUIDELINES

The project for this area is based on the recognition of the dominant environmental element of the Gulf which organizes the context's landscape and urban structure. One of the goals is to integrate and renew the urban and environmental contexts of the mining centers including Pozzo San Nicolò and Argentiera which are part of Sardinia's Geological-mining Park
